



From the Directors Chair,

I've been asked why Annie, why again, and why now? Annie is a show that, while set in the 1930's, is a timeless piece. The historic content in this show sets it clearly in the height of the Great Depression. However, Annie's struggle to find her family, and the joy she finds in discovering that family does not necessarily mean those that share the same blood line, is a plot that audiences across the world have identified with for ages. Annie's constant optimism is infectious to everyone she meets from the hungry and starving in the Hooverville's all the way to the President of the United States. Her ability to stick out her chin and grin, despite everything crumbling around her is a view that we need more of in our modern world.

On a more personal note, this is the second time I've directed Annie here at the Alban. The first time was 7 years ago, and it was the first theatrical production the Alban Arts Center ever produced. A lot has changed in 7 years, we now produce anywhere from 4-8 productions a year, have a wide array of talent to chose from, and have much larger community appreciation and support. The timing just felt right to remind our audiences of where we got our start. This show also reminds me personally of where I got my start as a director. Annie was the first show I ever directed, back in high school at the age of 17. I've directed many shows since then, but this show always becomes more that just another play, it burns itself into your heart as something so much more special. Maybe it's the catchy music, maybe it's the larger than life characters; but I believe it has something to do with the way that an entire community, on stage and off, falls in love with one little girl that refuses to give up and perseveres against all odds. Annie is not just a character, she is an example for us to strive to live our lives by. In a world of division, hate, and distrust, we need an example like Annie to remind us that "The sun will come out tomorrow, bet your bottom dollar that tomorrow there'll be Sun". Adam Bryan
